Welcome to our service of Holy Eucharist. All are welcome, we are glad that you are here. The *people* are invited to join in everything that is in **BOLD** type, while the Presider will speak the plain type.

The Presider greets the Community from the door to the Nave.

When we hear the good news of Christ but fail to share it with others:

When we do not love you with all our hearts nor our neighbours as ourselves:

Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy.

The Presider then says the following.

May the God of love and power forgive us and free us from our sins, heal and strengthen us by the Spirit, and raise us to new life in Christ our Lord.

First Reading: A reading from the Prophet Ezekiel

PSALM 130

The reader will read the light print, while the people will read the bold.

- 1 Out of the depths have I called to you; O God, hear my voice;* let your ears consider well the voice of my supplication.
- 2 If you were to note what is done amiss,*
 O God, who could stand?
- 3 For there is forgiveness with you;* therefore you shall be feared.
- 4 I wait for you, O God; my soul waits for you;* in your word is my hope.
- 5 My soul waits for you, more than the night-watch for the morning,* more than the night-watch for the morning.
- 6 O Israel, wait for God,* for with our God there is mercy;
- 7 With you there is plenteous redemption,* and you will redeem Israel from all their sins.

Glory to God our Creator, to God's most Holy Word, and to the Spirit, indwelling:* as it was in the beginning, is now and will be for ever. Amen.
