A READING FROM THE LETTER OF PAUL TO THE EPHESIANS, 1:3-14 (New Revised Standard Version)

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his

children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

The Lord be with you, and also with you.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John, Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

JOHN 1:(1-9) 10-18

[In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.]

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

The Gospel of Christ, Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Sermon

How is your ancient Greek? Our reading today from Ephesians is moment when an ability to read ancient Greek would be desirable, because the English translation does it no justice. The Beginning of Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, 1:3-14, was originally written in one long sentence. It is unincumbered by grammar, and reads much more like a poem. And like all poetry, the message is embedded in the form; the poetic style itself is part of the message. It is a message overflowing in praises and thanksgiving for God. We are reminded that we are the blessed ones, chosen even before the foundation of the world to receive God's blessings through Jesus Christ. We are adopted and redeemed, forgiven by God's grace. Through Christ we can glimpse the mystery of God and accept our inheritance of hope. As God's own people, we praise God's glory.

Poetry is of course art, and art has a way of communicating quite differently than written words. On the back of your bulletin today there are two versions of Ephesians 1:3-14 printed, a New Standard Revised Version (NSRV), which we commonly use in our services these days, and a King James Version (KJV), which many of us read while growing up. In fact I read the King James Version today because here the English translation is a little more poem-like and I think captures the message a little better; it gives us the news both through its content and its style.

My favourite books are ones where the style of the book plays a role in the story. Think of books that are written for example as diary entries; they leave us with a very intimate understanding of the character and their point of view. Or there is something called an epistolary novel, which is a story written as a series of documents. *Dracula* is one famous example.

Here, in in the opening lines of Ephesians, we have overflowing abundance. Paul's style is nothing less than extravagant, with a bewildering array of adjectives, pronouns and possessive nouns stacked together in one impressive sentence. Yet importantly, just as the style is extraordinary, so too is the claim, as God's actions here are indeed astonishing. Here we are emboldened to heap praises on God for his choosing and adoption of us, the people of God, the church. We have obtained an inheritance. It was always God's purpose to choose all people. We have been fore-ordained, fore-planned, fore-chosen as God's own from the very foundations of creation. This is universal and timeless. We have, not just two thousand years ago, but here and now, a flood of redemption and grace. This purpose, this wisdom and understanding, Paul claims, clarifies for us the mystery of God. Through the Holy Spirit, we are evermore inexorably connected, indeed participants in, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

This scripture is in fact all about our relationship with God's purpose and God's mystery, urged and animated by the Holy Spirit. God's ultimate plan has always been to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth. For Paul, this meant Gentiles and Jews. Diversity, which can sometimes cause problems, was planned diversity. No one is excluded from God's plan. This mystery of God's will had been revealed in Jesus Christ. Here, mystery is not like a crime novel, or a riddle to be solved, but rather something that goes beyond our human ability to discover or understand. It is not solved but revealed, revealed through Jesus Christ. The ultimate mystery of God's will is that God will gather all things, all people, together in Jesus Christ. "He has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ." And we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory.

Phew! I need a break. One urgent, compelling, long sentence, where Paul, as he gives emphasis to these blessings, cannot seem to stop himself. One writer puts it beautifully, "Here all creation is declared to be loved and redeemed by the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Thus the rambling form of the sentence, which seems to have trouble finding a place to stop, reinforces the claim that there is no end to God's grace. This is the grammar of worship more than it is the grammar of logical argument, and it is no surprise if we are left struggling to keep up." The grammar of worship indeed. This is mind-blowing!

Our words, our grammar, our adjectives fails us, but maybe art doesn't. Maybe as a poem, this scripture nudges our understanding just a little more. Art is many things including something that expresses an idea, an emotion or a world view. We of course have a long, rich tradition of divine imagery, which has been accumulating now for almost 2000 years. This alone says something of the complexity of knowing God. On the cover of your bulletin is a painting you will likely know, Vincent van Gogh's *Starry Night*, painted by the post-impressionist painter in 1889-90. Van Gogh once contemplated becoming a priest. He was a deeply devout man, believing that everything is more miraculous than one can comprehend. This idea was central to all his art. One art historian writes, "Vincent through his art was able to reveal a God "so real, so direct, so visible in nature and in people, so intensely compassionate, so weak and vulnerable, and so radically loving,...a God we all want to come close to." Interpreters suggest that the swirling brush strokes and rolling colour create an ethereal or dreamlike effect. The sky is divine, beyond human comprehension, dreamlike and just out of reach. Lower down, the trees and hills bend and swirl. Finally the village stands in contrast. Rigid, sharp angles separate it from the rest of the painting as humans are separated from the heavens. But with a church spire reaching to the sky, van Gogh brings God to the village. He reveals God to humans as the Church, the body of Jesus Christ.

There are so many ways to express our understanding of the mystery of God. There are so many ways to praise these gifts, planned for us and for all human-kind. Words, paintings, music, prayer and more. Be aware, be conscious and be full of grateful praise. Through Jesus

Christ we experience salvation and the Grace of God. We are God's chosen, adopted, redeemed people and for this we give endless praise. Amen.

Let us affirm the faith of our baptism. I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
